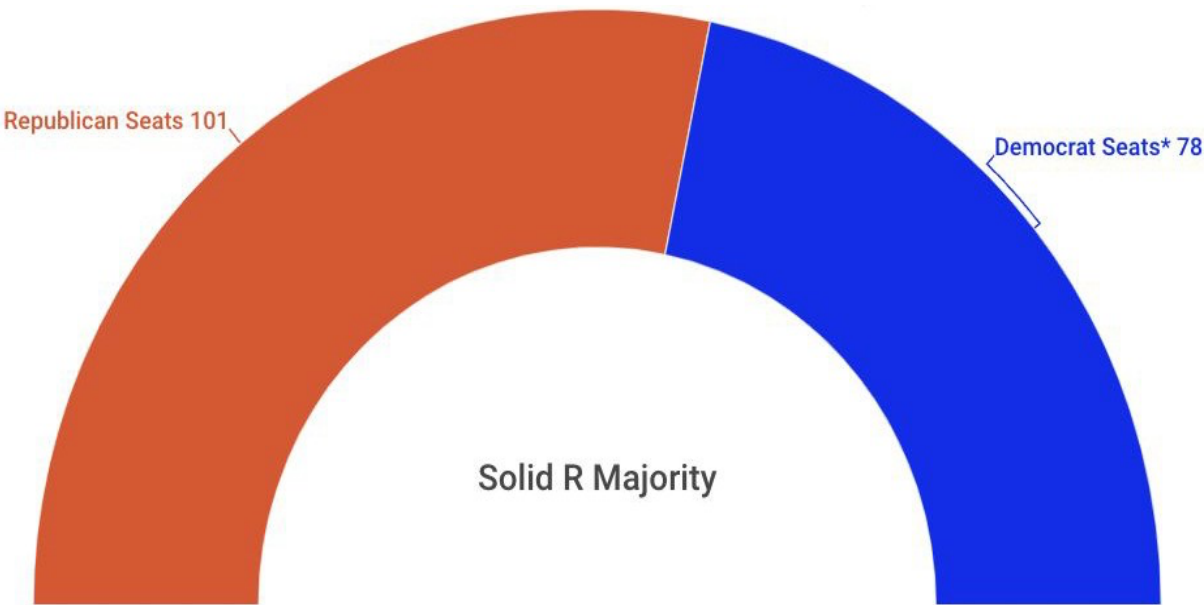


Georgia General Assembly: House

179 House seats faced reelection on November 8, 2022 (1 Special Election scheduled)

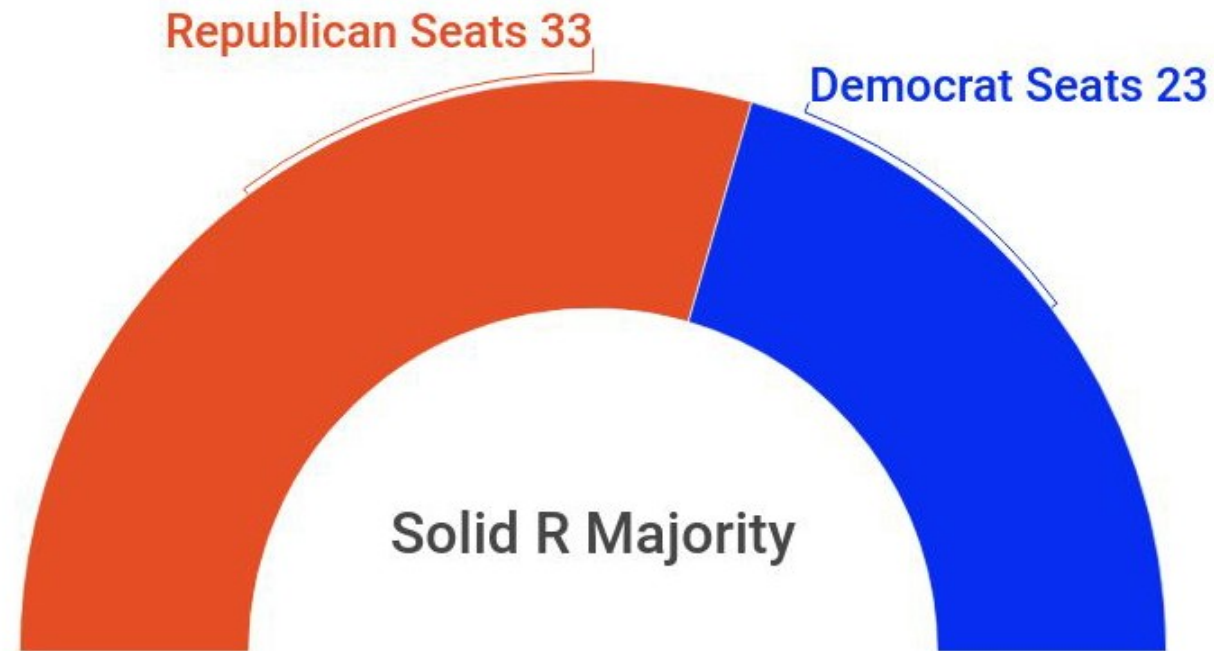


Number of votes needed to pass a bill: 91

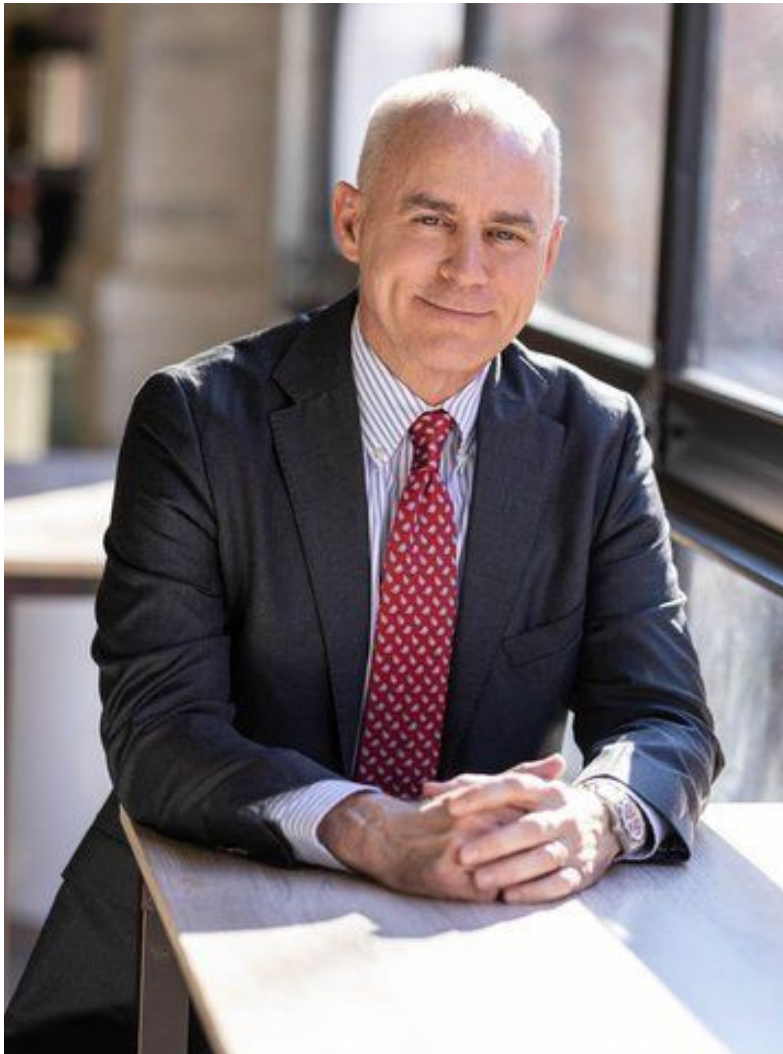

HD 24: Carter Barrett (R-Forsyth)



Counties: Forsyth

Preceded by: Rep. Sherri Gilligan (R)

About: Carter is a native Georgian and a graduate of UGA. He started Community Business Bank in 2006 and is now the North Atlanta Market President for Affinity Bank. He has lived in Forsyth County for over 30 years and has served on the Northside Hospital Foundation, United Way of Forsyth County, and the Forsyth County Chamber, among others.

HD 80: Long Tran (D-Dunwoody)



Counties: DeKalb

Preceded by: Rep. Matthew Wilson (D)

About: Long Tran, the owner of Peachy Corners Cafe, has worked tirelessly over the past four years to help elect candidates with integrity. As President of the Organized Neighbors of Summerhill, Phil has led community initiatives that secured 16 neighborhood security cameras, completed a multi-park project, and passed city legislation to limit development impacts on residents — legacy and new.
